
### PSALMODY (ELW p. 299)

The psalmody begins with a morning psalm of praise: Psalm 95:1-7a (the Venite), Psalm 63:1-8, Psalm 67, Psalm 100, or another appropriate psalm. The psalm may be preceded and followed by a general or seasonal invitatory. When the invitatory is sung, the following or a similar tone may be used, the assembly echoing the leader.





The invitatory may be repeated.

Before the reading, the leader may say:



The reading of scripture is followed by silence for reflection. The reflection may conclude with a scriptural dialogue.



OR



Amen.


